The Four Columbia River Tribes set the following fishery plan and the Columbia River Compact concurred:

## **Commercial Gillnet Fishery Zone 6**

Area	Zone 6	
Sanctuaries:	Standard river mouth and dam closed areas applicable to gillnet gear, except the Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary is not in effect.	
Gear:	Set and Drift Gill nets with NO minimum mesh size restriction	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon (any species), steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Fish landed during the open periods are allowed to be sold after the period concludes. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool and sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools may be kept for subsistence purposes.	
Additional:	24-hour quick reporting required for Washington buyers, pursuant to WAC 220-352-180 except that landings must be reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket.	

## Zone 6 Platform and Hook and Line Fishery

All regulations for the ongoing Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishery remain unchanged.

For information on other fisheries such as tributaries or downstream of Bonneville please consult the tribal Fish and Wildlife Departments directly.
