

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD**21BON079 MFR AFF Chinook and Coho Mortalities**

On the morning of 26 August, CRITFC biologists found one coho and one Chinook salmon on the valve 15 trash rack. Two fish were unclipped and anywhere not PIT tagged. The coho was found in good condition and the Chinook was found with fungus growing on its gills. CRITFC biologists also found a Chinook stuck on the flume door from sampling the day before. That fish was found in good condition, adipose was clipped, and no PIT tag found.
