

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: 13BON86 MFR – Chinook and coho salmon mortalities at Bonneville's Adult Fish Facility (AFF).

On 30 September 2013, University of Idaho personnel contacted Project Fisheries to report a coho salmon mortality found in the brail pool of the AFF. The fish was in very good condition. Two decomposed salmonids, assumed to be Chinook salmon, were also collected from the valve 15 trash rack. The two species are recorded and photographed separately. No fish were tagged.

Information is collected below:

- A. Species – Coho salmon (*Oncorhynchus kisutch*).
- B. Origin – Unknown.
- C. Length – 57 cm.
- D. Marks and tags – Not tagged, adipose clipped.
- E. Marks and Injuries found on carcass – None.
- F. Cause and Time of Death – Unknown.
- G. Future and Preventative Measures – Unknown.



- A. Species – Chinook salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*).
- B. Origin – Unknown.
- C. Length – 36 cm and 80 cm.
- D. Marks and tags – No tags, both unclipped.
- E. Marks and Injuries found on carcass – Both extremely decomposed.
- F. Cause and Time of Death – Unknown.
- G. Future and Preventative Measures – Unknown.
