

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: 14BON65 MFR – Chinook Salmon mortality at Bradford Island serpentine section.

On 10 September 2014, a researcher from Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission notified Project Biologists of a Chinook Salmon mortality at the Bradford Island serpentine section. The fish had been dead for some time. It apparently jumped onto the grating near PIT tag transceiver #4. There was a small gap in the plastic hurricane fencing wrapped around the railing. This gap will be fixed today. Information collected is provided below:

- A. Species – Chinook Salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*)
- B. Origin – Unknown. Adipose clipped.
- C. Length – 81 cm
- D. Marks and tags – Unknown. No PIT.
- E. Marks and Injuries found on carcass – No notable marks or injuries.
- F. Cause and Time of Death – Unknown. The fish had been dead a while.
- G. Future and Preventative Measures – Repairs to the gap in hurricane fencing around the PIT transceivers.
