## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: 15BON13 MFR – Chinook jack mortality at Bonneville's WA shore fishway.

On 13 June 2015, a Project Fisheries Biologist removed a dead Jack Chinook from the PIT detection walkway in the serpentine section of the WA shore ladder. The walkway has a barrier attached to the handrail to prevent fish from jumping and stranding themselves, but in this particular location the ties holding the barrier had come loose. The fish managed to jump at the precise location of the loose section of barrier, squeeze underneath, and strand itself.

## Information collected is provided below:

- A. Species-Chinook
- B. Origin unclipped
- C. Length -53 cm.
- D. Marks and tags No marks or tags.
- E. Marks and Injuries found on carcass None.
- F. Cause and Time of Death Stranding, early morning 13 June.
- G. Future and Preventative Measures Zip ties were used to re-secure the loose section of the protective barrier.
