Subject: 18BON46 - Pacific Lamprey mortalities in the Washington Shore UMTJ (1).

Description:

At approximately 0945 on 28 June 2018, two biologists from the Fisheries Field Unit cleared a single adult lamprey from Rest Box 2 of the Washington Shore UMTJ. The fish was found during routine inspections of the LPS.

The fish was scanned for PIT tags, measured and photographed. Due to the state of decomposition, the fish was returned to the river after these steps had been taken.

A. Species: Pacific Lamprey (*Entosphenus tridentatus*)

B. Origin: Appeared to be wild

C. Measurements:

a. Total length: 60.7cmb. Interdorsal Length: 6.3cm

D. Marks and Tags: None

E. Marks and injuries on carcass: NoneF. Cause and Time of Death: Unknown

G. Future Preventative Measures: We will continue regular inspection of LPSs, report on mortalities, and remove them so their alarm cue does not prevent other lamprey from using the LPS.
