

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD**SUBJECT: 20BON56 Adult Fish Facility Chinook Mortality.**

On Thursday, July 23rd, CRITFC biologists notified Project Biologists of a Chinook mortality found on the valve 15 trash rack of the AFF. The fish was scanned for PIT tags, inspected for any abnormal injuries, and returned to the river. No PIT tags were found. There was a large hole in the side that appeared to be infected and had severe swelling around it. There were also a few other smaller, but similar wounds across the body with similar swelling around each wound. The dorsal fin appeared to be extremely swollen and fraying.

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- A. Species – Chinook Salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*)
- B. Origin – Unknown.
- C. Length – Approximately 86 cm.
- D. Marks and tags – None.
- E. Marks and Injuries found on carcass – Large injury/hole with severe swelling around wound on side of carcass and some other smaller, but similar wounds. Dorsal fin very swollen and fraying.
- F. Cause and Time of Death – Injury and suspected bacterial infection; likely died sometime between 1400 July 22nd and 0900 July 23rd.
- G. Future and Preventative Measures – None.
