

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD**SUBJECT: 23BON062 MFR AFF Valve 15 Lamprey and Salmonid Mortalities**

On the morning of 20 July, Columbia River Inter-Tribal Fish Commission (CRITFC) Biologists notified Bonneville Project Biologists of four lamprey mortalities, one juvenile chinook mortality, and one sockeye mortality found on the valve 15 trash rack in the Adult Fish Facility (AFF). The fish were scanned for PIT tags, inspected, and returned to the river.
