Dear Operations Project Manager:

The Umatilla Tribe has implemented a project to restore Pacific lamprey (*Entosphenus tridentata*) to the tribes' ceded waters. This on-going project is funded by the Bonneville Power Administration and managed by the CTUIR. As part of the project we are requesting permission from the USACOE for access to enter John Day Dam project and collect adult Pacific lamprey.

We will place traps inside the fishway behind picketed leads and at areas that are highly coordinated with COE staff and workgroups from June through October. These traps have proven to be very effective at capturing lamprey at John Day Dam. Furthermore, we will operate the new lamprey trap at John Day South Fish ladder as well. We are excited to see the new trapping equipment and encourage the USACOE to continue implementing these traps at other projects.

A key component to restoring lampreys to the Umatilla River is to collect adults for translocation to the Umatilla Basin. CTUIR would like to enter the Corp projects to collect up to 910 adult Pacific lampreys among Bonneville, The Dalles and John Day dams (in separate letters of access sent to appropriate USACE staff of The Dalles Dam and Bonneville) and transport to our holding facility. The CTUIR will have all necessary permits for this activity. We will coordinate with Mrs. Tammy Mackey, Mr. Andy Traylor at Bonneville Dam, Mr. Bob Cordie and Mr. Paul Keller at The Dalles Dam, and Mr. Miro Zyndol at John Day Dam. We will continue to coordinate and report our collections with all USACE staff to ensure a smooth and safe operation, just like in the past recent years. CTUIR has the current versions of "A Guide For Fish Researchers, May 2009" for each appropriate project, and CTUIR will supply all information requested in the Guide prior to work beginning.

We appreciate the cooperation the USACOE has provided to date regarding Pacific lamprey, a culturally important resource of Northwest tribes.
