4. PERMIT REGULATIONS

- A. Permit must be carried by authorized collector(s) while in use during collection operations, and covers cooperative lamprey trapping and holding operations.
- B. Protected species shall not be taken unless specifically listed below. The permit holder is required to maintain compliance with the Nez Perce Tribal Code § 3-1-4 which deals specifically with activities associated with scientific, management and/or enhancement purposes of the Nez Perce Tribe.
- C. A quarterly report detailing implementation and other aspects of this permit will be provided to the Nez Perce Fish and Wildlife Commission.

5. SPECIFIC USE AND CONDITIONS

- A. Target species to be collected: Adult Pacific Lamprey (*Entosphenus tridentatus*)
- B. Action: Collect up to 1,240 adults during the 2016 active migration season at the Bonneville (215), The Dalles (601), and John Day (424) Dams for Snake River Basin lamprey translocation outplants. Collection targets may change based on actual run size. Fish collected by salvage during winter 2016-17 will be in addition to the 1,240 fish actively collected.
- C. Collection Location(s): Bonneville Dam, The Dalles Dam and John Day Dam.
- D. Project Purpose: To augment Pacific Lamprey production in the Snake River Basin.




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- E. Collection Method: Active, in season lamprey collections at Bonneville, The Dalles, and John Day Dams. NPT Department of Fisheries Resources Management will utilize lamprey traps, including those operated at the Bonneville Adult Fish Facility (BON AFF).
- F. Transport Information: Lamprey collected during winter will be transported in an insulated 400 gallon slip tank to the NPTH holding facility until outplanting in spring 2017.
- G. Release Locations: In Idaho: Lolo Creek, Little Canyon Creek, Newsome Creek, Orofino Creek, South Fork Salmon River, Secesh River, and Johnson Creek; in Washington: Asotin Creek; in Oregon: the Willowa River, Minam River, and Joseph Creek. Depending on collection numbers, other candidate release locations include, but are not limited to, Red River (South Fork Clearwater River) and Lostine River (Grande Ronde), and other areas as opportunity allows.
- H. Incidental Take: Take of Incidentally caught Endangered Species Act (ESA) listed fish is not anticipated due to the nature of the in-season trapping operations and winter salvage collection at the dewatered dam fishways as performed by the USACE staff. NPT staff members would have no contact with ESA listed fish for this activity.
- I. Indirect Mortality: Indirect mortality may not exceed 5% of the total sample taken for any species at any site.
- J. Reporting: A take report for all species captured or handled will be filed with appropriate coordinating agencies upon completion of this work within the calendar year in which it takes place.
