YAKAMA NATION SCIENTIFIC COLLECTOR'S PERMIT

- This Scientific Collector's Permit is issued by authority of the Yakama Nation pursuant to its status as a self-regulatory manager of fish and wildlife resources.
- The undersigned agencies, entities, or persons are authorized to take fish and wildlife species listed below for scientific purposes only, subject to the conditions of this permit.
- This permit is non-transferable. Agencies, entities, or persons not listed on this permit may not collect fish and wildlife species under authority of this permit.
- A report of take must be completed and returned to the tribal Fisheries Resource Management Program at termination of sampling activities.

CONDITIONS:

Location, species and number to be taken: Columbia River hydro dams (primarily John Day and McNary, but others as needed), Pacific Lamprey (Entosphenus tridentatus), juvenile/larvae, up to 1,000.

Purpose of collection: Genetic samples will be collected from these samples to monitor success of supplementation. Transfer will occur to a subset of these lamprey to conduct an acoustic telemetry and PIT tag juvenile passage study in the Yakima River (primarily between Union Gap and mouth), Wenatchee, as well as main stem Columbia River.

Disposition of catch: Once captured, lamprey may be genetically sampled, tagged, and released right away at the collection site. For other studies, lamprey may be placed into aerated totes and transferred initially to YN Prosser Hatchery in Prosser, WA. Fish will be tagged (acoustic or PIT) and subsequently released in the Lower Yakima River (primarily near Union Gap and near mouth of the river) or other study reaches of interest in the main stem Columbia River and tributaries to document migration and movement within the ceded lands.

Agency, entity, or persons authorized to take fish and wildlife under this permit: Yakama Nation Fisheries Resource Management Program, Pacific Lamprey Project (Ralph Lampman, Tyler Beals, Dave'y Lumley, Sean Goudy, Shekinah Saluskin & other crew members) and US Geological Survey Columbia River Research Laboratory staff (Theresa Marty Liedtke, Lisa Weiland, Ryan Tomka), and CRITFC staff.

Dates or duration of sampling activities (not to exceed current year): March 10, 2020 to February 28, 2021
