

**MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD 22 JFT 03 MFR Release Collected Fish at Lower Granite Dam**

**SUBJECT:** Release Collected Fish at Lower Granite Dam

**Narrative:** On the morning of June 13, 2022, Lower Granite Dam total river outflow reached approximately 208 kcfs. Due to the high river flow, the tug captain and Lower Granite Dam staff felt it was unsafe to load the collected fish on the barge for transport. Fish that had been collected for transport were released (Table 1) and collection for the June 13 transport trip continued.
