MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD: 17 LWG 11 Emergency Debris Spill

Subject: Emergency Spill Operation for Log Removal

Debris in the Lower Granite forebay continues to accumulate in front of the spillway and powerhouse. Large logs wedged between the RSW and debris boom resulting in mats of debris is a reoccurring problem. June 14 a mat of debris behind a wedged log covered about 1/3 of the area in front of the RSW. From 1045-1208 hours June 14 the Project closed the RSW and opened spillway 3 to remove the wedged log and debris. Operations deviated from the Fish Passage Plan (FPP) spill pattern with RSW closed and spillway 3 full open during the emergency spill. Spill volume remained unchanged during the debris spills.

Emergency Debris Spills) to prevent obstructions to fish passage. A diversion boom is being designed for installation during winter maintenance to prevent logs from floating into the problem area.
