MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD 14 MCN 04 Fish Mortality at north entrance to the Oregon shore fishway

SUBJECT: Fish Mortality at McNary Lock and Dam

Narrative: During the successful fish rescue of the north entrance to the Oregon fishway, on February 18, we recovered a seriously deteriorated carcass of an unclipped steelhead. We are uncertain of the cause of death and the time of death, due to the state of decay.

- A. Species: Steelhead
- **B.** Origin: Unclipped; could be wild or from a tribal hatchery.
- C. Length: Approximately 20".
- **D.** Marks and Tags: None obvious; carcass severely deteriorated.
- **E.** Marks and Injuries Found on the Carcasses: None obvious; carcass severely deteriorated.
- **F.** Cause of Death: Nothing obvious. Carcass severely deteriorated. Possibly a hook and release mortality? Was just found on the grating after we pumped the pool down to the grating level. Possibly drifted down through the ladder from the forebay.
- **G. Future and Preventative Measures:** There was no obvious clue as to what killed the fish, so we don't know what to do to prevent such a future loss. We successfully rescued another steelhead at the same time, and several non-salmonids, mostly walleye.
