## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

**SUBJECT:** 14 MCN 16 MFR Fish Loss on McNary Spillway Deck

## Narrative:

On Monday, June 30 at about 1400 hours on the spillway deck by bay 3 on the east side of the deck Assistant Biologist Bobby Johnson found approximately 30 lost sub yearling Chinook smolts in about a 3 feet diameter circle. Ten and five were in matted wads with maggots about 1/4 inch long. They had been driven on. The remaining 15 were scattered around and north of these mats and the maggots were 1/8 inch long.

We suspect that some large bird, such as a pelican or cormorant, regurgitated them at that location. Not known why.

**A. Species:** Approximately 30 sub-yearling Chinook...

- **B.** Origin: Mixed clipped and unclipped? Hard to tell due to their poor condition.
- **C. Length:** 3-5"
- D. Marks and Tags: None.
- E. Marks and Injuries Found on the Carcasses: Badly deteriorated.
- **F.** Cause of Death: Probably swallowed by a bird and regurgitated.
- **G.** Future and Preventative Measures: Continue active bird hazing program. We are currently running two shifts of hazers a day, plus boat hazing 3 days per week. Continue lethal take of gulls; continue to use propane cannons and electronic bird alarms.
