COLONY MONITORING & WATERBIRD SURVEYS

McNary Pool above the Snake River Confluence: Site visited on July 18.

Island 20

Water levels have continued to recede, and the island was vacant of all gulls (*Figure 1*). PIT-tag recovery on the northern and southern gull nesting colonies will be carried out in the coming weeks.

Potholes Reservoir: Site visited on July 20.

Goose Island

Water levels have continued to recede, exposing more shoreline habitat on Goose Island. 45 Caspian terns (42 adults, 3 fledglings) were observed on the South Spit shoreline (*Figure 2*). These were the first tern fledglings observed on Goose Island in 2022. It is unclear if the fledglings were raised on Goose Island or came from a nearby colony, since they were all capable of flight.

No piscivorous waterbirds were observed at colonies in North Potholes Reservoir (2016 colony, NE Potholes, and North Potholes).
