MEMORANDUM FOR Biologist, Operations Division (CENWP-OD)

SUBJECT: Bonneville Project, Fishway and Fish Activities for <u>Week 21</u> of 2021, which covers the period from <u>16</u> to 22 May 2021.

1. OPERATION SUMMARY:

- a. Daily average river flows ranged from 211.6 to 229.2 kcfs. Daily average powerhouse forebay elevation ranged from 74.2' to 75.1' msl. Daily average project tailwater ranged from 17.3' to 18.2' msl. Secchi disk measurements ranged 6.0' to 7.0'. Daily average water temperature ranged 57 to 58°F.
- b. Daily average spill ranged from 132.4 to 133.1 kcfs. Spring spill season began on 10 April and will continue through 15 June in accordance with FOP guidelines.
- c. <u>Unit Operation</u>. **PH2** remains the priority powerhouse. Main unit drawdowns are measured every Monday and more frequently as needed.

d. <u>Fish Units</u>. Second Powerhouse fish units provide attraction flow for the Washington Shore (WS) fish ladder.

2. MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES:

- a. <u>Auxiliary Water System Closures</u>. Nothing to report.
- b. <u>STS/VBS Inspections</u>. Nothing to report.
- c. <u>Dewatering and Fish Salvages</u>. Nothing to report.

3. RESEARCH:

- a. <u>Four Peaks Environmental Fish counting contract</u>: Daytime visual counting (0500 to 2100 PDT) began on 01 April. Night video (2100 to 0500 PDT) counting began 15 May. Fish counts can be viewed <u>here</u>.
- b. <u>USFWS Lamprey Metamorphosis Study</u>: Juvenile lamprey researchers are onsite, and the work is underway.
- c. Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission Smolt Monitoring: Sample collections at the SMF began at 0700 on 02 March. Debris at the primary dewatering structure (PDS) and fish/debris separator was light consisting mostly of sticks. Gas Bubble Trauma (GBT) examinations began on 10 April and are typically preformed 2 days/week through the end of spill season. Results from this week's GBT examinations: 200 yearling Chinook and steelhead examined: Two fish (1.0%) were observed with GBT symptoms. Native, non-salmonid GBT exams were conducted by SMP personnel in conjunction with ODFW Predation Studies/electroshocking work being performed in Bonneville tailrace this week. A total of 48 fish were examined for GBT and 4 were observed with symptoms. Fallbacks observed this week included 12 steelhead. No fish collections for research purposes were conducted this week. - d. <u>USDA Pinniped and Avian Hazing</u>: Deck-based hazing continues.
- e. State Agency Pinniped Trapping: Sea lion trapping began on 05 April.
- f. WDFW/ PSMFC Pikeminnow Sampling: Hook and line angling activities continue for Northern Pikeminnow within the BON BRZ as a constituent of Gas Bubble Trauma (GBT) monitoring.
- g. <u>CRITFC Adult Salmonid Sampling</u>: Adult Salmonid sampling in the AFF began on 20 April and typically occurs 5 days per week.




Figure 1. Average fishway temperatures from 16 to 22 May.
