We have also been grabbing broodstock and stockpiling females for outplanting above Cougar Dam.
- Sampling ponds and starting our annual pond inventories were other fish culture duties completed this week.
- Sarah Bjork was here Friday for the monthly fish health check where she found all fish to be in great health.
