- We assisted Minto out planting a couple loads of adult ChS into the Breitenbush river as well as setting up pipes on a new outplant site on the N. Santiam. We also assisted with recycling StS.
- Clagget Lake was backpack stocked this week.

- The adult salmon collection has slowed considerably this week with 145 fish collected. We added some fish to broodstock and outplants we are holding and were still able to give the Eugene Mission 500 lbs of fish. We have now given out over 40,000 lbs of fish to charity. This is a pretty big number for us and great thing for the tribal and food share communities.
- Fish marking started this week with the auto trailer, we were able to get 215,000 fish marked and half of those CWT. We will kick it back into gear on 7/6 after the marking supervisors vacation time.
- This is Kurt Cummings last full week of employment with ODFW after 36 years, be sure to call next Mon or Tues if you have been procrastinating to say hello or just to give him a bad time.

- We started to see an increase in CHS number but water still 50 degrees.
- We continue to recycle small numbers of STS to Mehama.
- We hauled the second load of NON-Marked CHS to Horn Ck.
- Continuing installing new outplant site on the N. Santiam.

Roaring River

- Liberations for the week included N Santiam R., Breitenbush R., Ollalie Lk, and Quartzville. We also stocked Detroit Lake and some high lakes which included Billy, Crabtree, and 6000-line all with some 72T14 Rb fingerlings.
- We moved about 8000 Rb legal trout from upper raceway to two lower raceways to make our trophy fish for next year. They all looked good.
- Craig Banner was here to do a fish health check on our fish and found a little bit of trich on some Rb fingerlings but not enough to treat. We are waiting on cultures he took from STS and RB for cold water.
- The rest of the week has been spent doing normal fish culture activities and breaking down and pressure washing ponds.

Rock Creek

- We have been battling disease outbreaks on our StS, StW and Fishwich Rb this past month w/ heavy losses incurred do to a multitude of pathogens. While we were carrying surplus that surplus is now gone. Columnaris on all species but none as virulent as the steelhead and rainbow fry outbreaks. 5515 StS received H₂O₂ before transferring them outside and are now receiving potassium permanganate, Aquaflor. TM200F, formalin and chloramine T., that just about covers it.
- Water temperatures are hovering around 65 as we have already had from Rock Creek highs of 70. We are pumping from the N Umpqua. 30% chance of rain predicted for Saturday along w/ thunder storms.
- The raceway project is for all intents and purposes complete w/ a small punch list for next Monday.



S. Santiam

- The Foster Trap was operated on Tuesday of this week. All unmarked StW and ChS are now being hauled upstream to the Gordon Road release site.
