- Basic fish culture duties have taken up the remainder of the time this week. Cleaning weirs and intakes has been a headache the last couple of weeks with no overflow at Marion Creek intake and all the leaves and needles coming down.

- We shocked, counted and shipped eggs out of our second egg group this week. 576,000 eyed eggs were transferred to Gnat Creek on Wednesday with another 170,000 trayed down. Shock loss was very reasonable at 4%.

It will take some modifying if we wish to continue sorting that way. Gloves do work well especially when the fish is completely out of the water. Our first spawn will be next week.
- Moved 4 year old brood from R-15 to R-16 for sorting and spawning purposes. Broke down R-15 to pressure wash.
- Contractor was here to install the new powder coated manifold for our well tower.
- Work continues on making new frames for egg baskets.
