<u>FPP SECTION</u>: Chapter 4 (JDA), section 3.2.3.2 Non-Routine Maintenance - Turbines and Spillbays.

<u>JUSTIFICATION FOR CHANGE</u>: Last year a change was made to this section to incorporate safety policies related to climbing spill inspections. Unfortunately, the proposed verbiage is a bit misleading. The verbiage basically states if there is a maintenance activity on spillbay-2 that the project should spill from bay-5 for attraction flow instead of bay-3. Whereas this is correct for performing climbing spillbay inspections (as safety dictates having adjacent spillbays closed (see FPP change form 23JDA01)), it doesn't apply to any other maintenance activities. See below for the <u>previously proposed change</u>...

Between September 1 and the end of November, spillbay 2 may be closed for up to one workday for maintenance activities. During the outage, operate spillbay 35 for adult attraction flow. Efforts should be made to minimize the outage as much as possible.

In order to alleviate the confusion, JDA would like to rephrase this same statement to make it apply to both the climbing spillway inspections and any other maintenance-related outages.

PROPOSED CHANGE:

3.2. Fish Facilities Non-Routine Maintenance

3.2.3. Turbines and Spillbays.

3.2.3.2. Between September 1 and the end of November, spillbay 2 may be closed for up to one workday for maintenance activities. During the outage, operate spillbay—5_3 for adult attraction flow. For safety purposes, while performing spillway climbing inspections on spillbays 1-3, spillbay 5 may be operated in place of spillbay 2. After completing climbing inspections for spillbays 1-3 spillbay 2 should be reopened for attraction flows. Efforts should be made to minimize the outages as much as possible.
